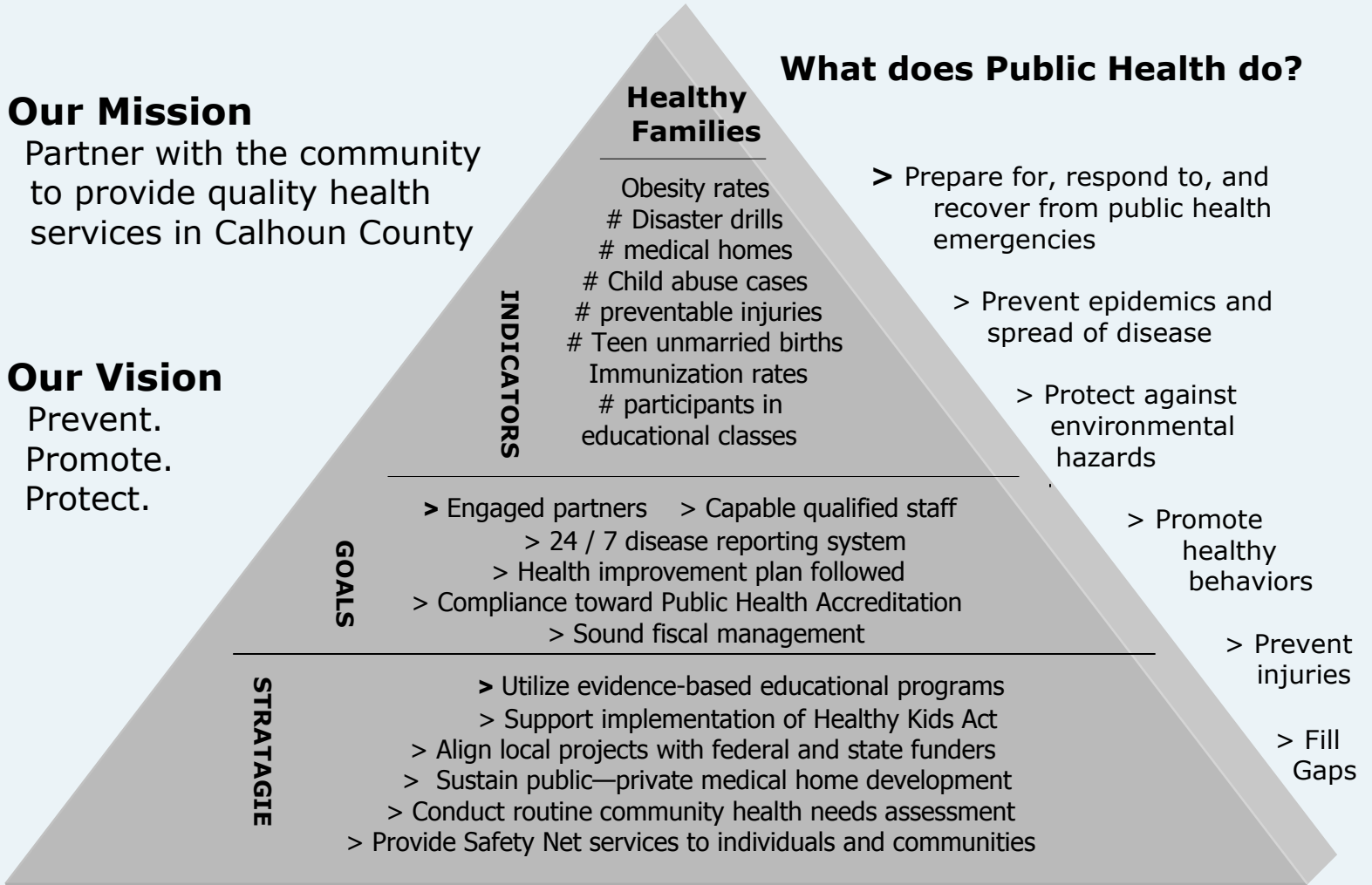

AED Loaner Program initiated with **2** AEDs available for community use.

## PROMOTE HEALTHY BEHAVIORS

### Adults

- 2-10 week NAMI family support educational classes; 5-9 attendees per week
- Sun Safety at Ragbrai, 1,000 packets of sunscreen given out
- Tobacco prevention/cessation to Lion's Club – 35 attendees
- Methodist Women presented on mental health –30 attendees
- Work place wellness packs distributed – 8 businesses
- Instructed 8 health care professionals on Quitline system
- Tobacco Prevention – Referrals, Development, Outreach.

### Children

- Nutrition and physical activity at the Pomeroy Public Library – 25 attendees
- Tobacco prevention and cessation education at SCC middle school – 130 students, 4 Titans Against Tobacco meetings – 16 attendees, Kidzmania – 1,200 attendees
- 680 home visits made to 31 families to improve or maintain healthy functioning, problem solving and communication
- 52 children 0-5 years of age received benefits of improved parenting skills
- Education: Fall Fling (Resource and Referral), I-Smile, Girl Talk, School Health Coordination, Positive Behavior Intervention and Support, Loving Your Family (nutrition), Moms offering Moms Support weekly sessions
- 54 nurse visits for child health; 47 nurse visits maternal health; 32 social work visits maternal health
